ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 1

God, the Creator of All Things

We believe and confess that there is one God who created, preserves and reigns supreme in all the universe. God created the heavens and the earth and all that is in them, by direct act, in six literal 24 hour days. God revealed Himself in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus referred to this trinity when He gave command to teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

A. God, the Father

B. God, the Son

We confess the deity of the Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, and believe He is the Word who is God, who was in the beginning with God. The Apostle Paul described Jesus Christ as God, exalted and supreme over all, and blessed forever.

We believe the Son is both God and man in one person, born of a virgin. Through the incarnation He became our mediator to reconcile us to God by His blood on the cross.

Through His work of redemption, Jesus Christ revealed Himself as Prophet, Priest and King. As Prophet, he declared the whole counsel of God concerning salvation, substantiating it by signs and miracles. As Priest, he offered one sacrifice for sins forever, then sat down on the right hand of God. For by one sacrifice He hath perfected forever them that are sanctified. As King, he gives commands and judges and protects and rewards His own. Jesus Christ must reign until God hath put all enemies under His feet. He shall come again to rule and judge the world and reign forever and ever.

C. God, the Holy Spirit

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 2

The Holy Scriptures

2 Peter 1:21 2 Tim. 3:16 We believe and confess that God has given us the Holy Scriptures as the infallible witness to divine truth. The original manuscripts were verbally inspired by the Holy Spirit as declared by the Apostle Peter: "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Spirit."

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 3

The Image of God in Man and Adam's Fall

We believe and confess that in the beginning, God created man in His own image. "So God created man in His own image, in the image of God created He him."

God gave unto man the Garden of Eden as a dwelling place, and also the dominion over the animal creation. But alas, man did not remain in this happy state.

When Adam and Eve were tempted by the serpent, who is the Devil, they transgressed God's law by eating of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. The result of their disobedience was that they and all their posterity fell into sin and death. "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin, and so death passed upon all men, for all have sinned." The death which came upon Adam and his posterity was threefold:

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 4

Redemption Through Christ

We believe the Gospel is the good news that the Lord God provided the only way of salvation for sinful man by sending His Son, Jesus Christ, as the Savior of the world. All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. Man is sinful, condemned, and deserving of death. God is holy and just; therefore He punishes all sin. Because God is merciful, He took our sin with its condemnation on Himself in the John 3:16 Rom. 3:21-26

Isa. 53:4-11 Person of His Son who shed His blood for the remission of sin and was raised for our justification. Peter states that Gal. 3:13 Christ redeemed us with His precious blood. The Scriptures Heb. 9:28 further declare, "This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save Rom. 4:25 sinners." "He hath appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice 1 Pet. 1:18-19 of Himself." "That through death He might destroy him that 1 Tim. 1:15 had the power of death, that is, the Devil, and deliver them Heb. 9:26 who through fear of death, were all their lifetime subject to Heb. 2:14-15 bondage." As our sin-bearing substitute and representative, Jesus

Christ became man, suffered, died, and was buried; on the third day, He arose from the grave, and forty days after His resurrection, ascended into heaven. Jesus has finished the whole work of reconciliation and has obtained an eternal redemption for believers. His love and grace are proclaimed to us through the Gospel in order that all who believe in Jesus Christ should not perish but have eternal life. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on Him." "For He hath made Him who knew no sin, to be sin for us, that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him."

But whoever will not receive Jesus Christ as personal Savior is lost because of his unbelief. "He that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 5

The Universal Grace of God and Man's Free Will

We confess that the grace of God revealed in the gift of His Son is universal grace. Grace is the limitless love and mercy of God acting in compliance with the demands of His righteousness, thereby completely ruling out human effort. Since man cannot come to Christ on his own, God, in grace, reaches out to the sinner to draw him to salvation. God's grace bestows upon the believer Christ's righteousness and through the ministry of the Holy Spirit roots and grounds the believer in the Gospel, bringing him to spiritual maturity.

God works in believers to will and to do His good pleasure and yet appeals to them to yield themselves to Him.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 6

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 10

The Ministry in the Church

We believe that God has established certain offices in the church for the purpose of equipping and upbuilding the body The apostles ordained certain men as elders of Christ. (ministers) to shepherd the church, and thev commissioned their followers to continue this order.

The office of the minister in the church is a divine institution. The church shall, when necessary, choose such men who have the qualifications for the office as listed in 1 Tim. 3:1-7 and in 1 Peter 5. These men shall proclaim and

They shall, by the willing contribution of the church, be enabled to carry on charitable work for those who have needs in the congregation, and extend a helping hand and carry on a spiritual ministry where opportunity affords so that the church may be well taken care of according to the will of God.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 11

Holy Baptism

Acts 8:36-38 Matt. 3:5-6 Matt. 3:13-17

We believe that water baptism should be administered to all who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior and who have repented and confessed their sins to God. The Lord Jesus Christ Himself was baptized and commanded His disciples saying, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." The Apostles followed this command faithfully. We follow their example as they preached repentance to God and faith in the Lord Jesus and baptized only those who received the preaching of the Word and made a confession of their faith. Christian water baptism is a symbol of the baptism of the believer into the death of Christ. The person who is baptized is giving public testimony to the cleansing power of the blood of Christ in his life and to his intention of walking in newness of life by the Spirit. Baptism also symbolizes the believer's union with Christ and His church.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 12

The Lord's Supper

We confess that the Lord Jesus Christ instituted holy communion with His disciples. "...the Lord Jesus, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, Take, eat; this is my body, which is broken for you; this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also He took the cup, when He had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood; this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord's death till He come."

The participation of communion embraces many blessings for those who partake worthily. It creates in the believer a sincere love and gratitude to God and Jesus Christ. It also produces a spirit of brotherly love and unity in the body of believers. Those who are to be worthy recipients of communion must exercise a life of faith and repentance and should be at peace with God and their fellow men.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 13

Christian Marriage

We believe God instituted marriage when He presented Eve to Adam, and ordained that there be but one man and one woman in marriage until separated by death. Gen. 1:27-28a Gen. 20:20-24

This is affirmed by Christ when He said: "...Have ye not read, He who made them at the beginning made them male and female, and said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they two shall be one flesh? Wherefore they are no more two, but one flesh."

Sexual intimacy is a wonderful gift of God that is only to be expressed between a man and a woman within the love and bonds of marriage. Therefore, we believe that any other form of sexual intimacy is both immoral and a perversion of God's gift.

We further believe that divorce grieves God who said, "I hate divorce," and that it is outside His will as expressed in the words, "What therefore God hath joined together, let no man put asunder." Jesus said, "...whoever shall put away his wife, and marry another, committeth adultery against her. And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery." Furthermore "...whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery."

Persons entering matrimony are to do so in harmony with God's Word. They are not to be close blood relatives as stated in Leviticus 18 and 20. They are both to be "in the Lord"; therefore, the marrying of a believer to an unbeliever is unscriptural.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 14

The Office of Government

We confess that the government is a divine institution to which we should be subject and obedient in all things that do not oppose the law of God. God has place upon government the responsibility to reward those who do good and punish those who do evil. We should honor and respect those in authority and faithfully and willingly pay our taxes. In this way we follow the command of our Savior to pay tribute money. We are also exhorted to pray to God for Kings, and for all who are in authority. We can accept a government position if such position does not conflict with our obligations to God. We should strive to live as the meek and lowly in the world.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 15

Vengeance, Non-resistance and Suffering

We confess that the Lord Jesus said: "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbor and hate thine enemy. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, do good to them that hate you, bless them that curse you, and pray for them that despitefully use you, and persecute you; that ye may be the children of your Father which is in Heaven." Paul also taught: "Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men. Avenge not yourselves, dearly beloved: but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord. Therefore, if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink; for in so doing, thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good." From these words we see that all vengeance is forbidden us.

We believe that all human life, including the unborn, is sacred, being created in the image of God. The Apostle John said, "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death. Whosoever hateth his brother is a murderer; And ye know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in him." The attitude of our heart and the words we speak should demonstrate a life of peace. We follow the Lamb where He goes, not rendering evil for evil or railing for railing, but in quietness, bless, if we want to merit a blessing.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 16

Church Discipline

We believe and teach that church members who live in sin and willful disobedience become subject to the discipline of the church. The goal of Church Discipline is always restoration. The Lord Jesus gave instruction on discipline Matt. 5:43-45

when He said, "Moreover if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone: if he shall hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother. But if he will not hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established. And if he shall neglect to hear them, tell it unto the church; but if he neglect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican." If a member who is practicing sin does not respond to the steps of Matthew 18, then the individual is to be excluded from the congregational membership that the seriousness of sin may be Although this instruction applies to sins between believers, it is possible that this individual has never experienced salvation, for the Apostle Paul teaches that anyone who practices continual, willful disobedience to God will not inherit the kingdom of God. This person should not be considered to be an enemy but one who needs to be saved or restored to fellowship with God and with the church. The members should be in prayer and supplication to God on behalf of this excluded person. If this individual acknowledges and confesses the sins which he committed and shows genuine fruits of repentance and properly applies for readmission into the church, then the members are to forgive him and receive him back into the church.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 17

The Resurrection of the Dead

Job 19:25-27 Isa. 26:19 Dan. 12:2

We believe that everyone who dies shall live again and be raised from the dead. This is clearly taught in the Old and New Testaments. Daniel, the prophet, spoke of a resurrection of the just and a resurrection of the unjust. In John 5:28-29, Christ spoke of two separate resurrections. There will be a resurrection to life for those who believe in Christ and a resurrection to judgment for those who reject Him. The resurrection for the believer will take place when Christ returns for His church as Paul states in 1 Thess. 4:13-18. The unbeliever will be resurrected a thousand years later and

brought to the great white throne of judgment and then cast into the lake of fire to be forever separated from God.

ARTICLE OF FAITH NO. 18

The Judgments

We believe that, according to the Scriptures, judgment is necessary in order that the righteousness of God be vindicated, and that all righteousness be rewarded and that all evil be exposed to receive its just recompense. "Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts; and then shall every man have praise of God." "But after thy hardness and impenitent heart treasurest up unto thyself wrath against the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God; Who will render to every man according to his deed."

We believe that the believer's judgment for sin is found at the cross. The Scriptures teach that there will be no judgment for those in Christ. Believers will appear before the judgment seat of Christ so that their works may be made manifest. This examination is to determine the inner character and motivation of the believer to prove whether his works are acceptable or unacceptable and to be rewarded accordingly.

We also believe in other judgments.

1. The judgment of the nations

"When the Son of man shall come in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, then shall He sit upon the throne of His glory, and before Him shall be gathered all nations: and He shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats."

2. The judgment of the dead

"And I saw a great white throne, and Him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great stand before God; and the books were opened, and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in
